
When cooking with LPGas:

Turn off the cylinder.





Do not remove the regulator or appliance until the gas has been switched off.

Close the valve and take the cylinder outside. If there are flames, use a damp cloth to protect your hands.





Take the cooker/ cylinder to your nearest dealer to have it checked.

Do not put a leaking cylinder in your car.

Never look for a leak using a naked flame.





Place your cylinder on a level surface.




Large cookers connect to your cylinder with a regulator.
